



Therefore will I trust You always, though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death, I will not fear, for You are ever with me, and will never leave me to face my perils alone.

I find this reassuring, as I also know that Jesus will never leave me. Despite our uncertainties, we can also take comfort from the joys of Spring and remember with gratitude to those who gave the Allies the victory of VE day, 80 years ago.

Let's also give thanks for Julia and Elaine's sterling work in supporting our villages through the SCAN magazine.



#### Forthcoming Events

The next Chich Chats will be held from 10.30 a.m. until noon on Tuesday, May 13<sup>th</sup>. and Tuesday June 10<sup>th</sup>. in the village hall.



On the evening of Thursday, May 8<sup>th</sup>. the **eightieth anniversary** of **V.E. Day** will be commemorated nationally. We will be taking part in our village.

At 9.30 p.m. lanterns will be lighted in the centre of the village adjacent to the War Memorial. You are invited to bring along your own lantern if you wish. An official Peace Lantern has been purchased; this will take a central part in the display of light. This will be particularly appropriate in Chicheley as it was the sight of an R.A.F. searchlight during World War 11 as part of the protection for Cranfield Aerodrome.

# North Crawley Parish Council Bulletin April 2025

Hi Folks, Steve here with feedback on the Parish Council issues and activities. At last, we have 3 of the SID's up and running - you've no doubt seen them at the entrance to the village from Cranfield, halfway along Brook End and in the High St near Nixey's Walk. As they are powered by solar panels now, they no longer need the constant battery change we faced before. And more good news! We have been successful with our grant application which allows us to now order two more solar powered SID's for Chicheley Rd and Folly Lane. Our Clerk and two of our Councillors are being trained to program the SID's, retrieve and interpret the data as well as how to forward it to Highways and the Police to ensure we receive the support we need if speeding is prevalent.

We are still on the lookout for a new Village Warden to help around the village (any handy person who fancies a few paid hours a week keeping the village safe and tidy please contact Sheila, our Clerk). Meanwhile Sheila and I are keeping the 8 village waste bins clear for the time being but in due course we will need to employ a contractor if we have no applicants for the Warden's role.

We are going to put a new sign up at the Waste Ground that more clearly explains the basis on which parking is allowed. This follows a recent planning application that incorrectly describes the area in front of the Church as a public car park. In fact it is land owned by the PC which is registered as the Village Green. Parking is only allowed on a concessionary basis which can (and occasionally is) withdrawn if, for example, there is a major function at the Church or War Memorial.

We have an immediate vacancy for a Parish Councillor and would be most grateful if you could give some serious thought to joining us. There are many small but important roles the PC carries out which help our Parish to remain the clean, safe and well managed environment we enjoy living in. Without volunteers doing this work, the responsibility would defer back to MKCC who would be extremely unlikely to apply the same diligence and sense of priority that your PC does. Indeed much would simply not get done. Being a Councillor doesn't need to be a time-consuming role - just attending the meetings is a great help which allows us to form opinions and decisions on important matters for the Parish. Please consider giving a few hours a month to this vital role if you can.

The developers for the Orchard Way and Chicheley Rd sites are still wading their way through the planning process with MKCC and are making slow but sure

progress. The Implementation Group are continuing to monitor progress and stand by each month to meet if there are any issues to discuss or deal with.

A small group of Councillors met with Chris Curtis MP and had a wide-ranging discussion on local issues. He seemed to recognise most of the concerns we raised such as the swamping of local GP and Pharmacy resources, the rapid Eastward expansion of MK and the pressure on school places for children in rural areas. Whilst there was little concrete resolution he could offer (especially for MK expansion) he did agree to support improvements in local services and resources. It is worth mentioning Chris is the only MP any of us could recall who had requested a 1:1 meeting with the PC to listen to issues that are important to us. And for this we thank him for his time.

Our next meeting is on 6th May and is preceded by the Annual Parish Meeting at 7pm where members of the public are welcome to raise any issues of concern with the PC which we can add to the agenda of future meetings. We'd love to see you there!



# North Crawley Annual Parish Meeting 2025 7.00 pm on Tuesday 6 May 2025 in the Institute

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Tuesday 6 May at 7 pm in the Institute. This is not a Parish Council meeting but a meeting where the residents can talk about those things that are important to them.

Although the Chair will give a summary of the activities of the Parish Council during the year, the focus of the meeting will be on asking you for your views on the things the Parish Council can influence.

It will be informal but structured to ensure that all the issues you think are important are covered. We aim to start promptly at 7 pm, and the monthly Parish Council meeting will take place afterwards.

Please try to come along so you can meet your Councillors and help the Parish Council to develop its plan for the coming years.

# North Crawley Parish Council Village Warden

Due to the retirement of the present Village Warden, there is now a vacancy for this post. The role is part time, for 2 hours each week, worked on a flexible basis. The salary for the post is £12.85 per hour (£1,336 per annum). More hours may be available for ad hoc work as required.

The Warden is responsible for the tidiness and general upkeep of the village and includes ad hoc work such as minor repairs, installing new litter bins and seats, etc. as required. Monthly visual inspection of the play equipment is also part of this role for which training will be given by RoSPA.

The successful candidate must be reliable, capable of carrying out the work needed and, given the nature of the work, be prepared to spend much of the time outdoors.

The role is available immediately.


#### **Thumbstick Walkers**

progressively warmer as the morning passed. Coats and jumpers were carried.




One highlight of the walk was seeing 3 Roe deer in a family group in the biggest field on the return.

At the April meeting the attendees collected £200 in donations for **Willen at Home** - a service that provides great support across MK.

#### Community Art Project (Section 106 Grant Funded)

The Milton Keynes Arts Centre Project Team have reviewed the feedback from the events and the survey.

A detail specification for the Art Commission has been prepared and now they are inviting interest and applications from artists across the UK. The process of selecting an artist will proceed during May and the selected candidate should be ready to start work in the Village soon.

#### **Biodiversity Projects**

Bird Nesting season is upon us and Dog Walkers are asked to keep their dogs on leads when walking in the fields. We have a wide range of species in Sherington – Seeing Barn Owls and hearing Woodpeckers in the Village are a joy. If you look up and see Red Kites soaring overhead, do listen out for their cry like call.

At home after scarifying to remove moss (a green bin full) we planted some grass seed to repair the lawn. It wasn't long before 3 pigeons landed and started eating the scattered seed. Knocking on windows, opening doors and clapping were all used to shoo the birds. They were persistent and returned daily. That got the attention of two neighbourhood cats I'd not seen before, another nuisance as they left deposits!. You can imagine my surprise when one morning I witnessed a sparrow hawk chasing two fat pigeons out of the garden – flying low and at speed a very powerful and effective deterrent. (like a WW2 fighter chasing2 bombers)

Sad News: God's Acre

The mowers have been very active in the Churchyard and the plantings at St Lauds' Biodiversity project have been mowed over. This plot had been started by the late David Williams and has been cared for by a number of volunteers over the past three years. Due to a number of factors the plantings have not developed and it has been decided to return the plot to grassland. (for now)





Good News: High Street

After the flooding in December 2020 a team of volunteers worked on the clearance of heavy overgrown vegetation along High Street near the entrance to Masons Field. Over the past 2 years a more delicate activity has been taking place – the planting of a new hedge, and flowers on the bank of the stream. The project is extending along the bank toward Harriet's End. You may have noticed the crop of snowdrops earlier this year, at the time of writing the cowslips are in bloom. It's worth taking a look – and

perhaps walk up to the church on the Right of Way through Mason's Field & The Ridings – and experience nature in the heart of the Village

Maypole Dancing – The Knoll 1990's Road




VE Day 1945 – Party in Park


