

Dear Friends,

May I use this opportunity to thank our previous editors for their efforts, to welcome Mike Richardson as our new Editor and to thank him for offering his services.

On the first Sunday of every month, at 10.30 in St Laud's, Sherington, we hold a 'Something Different' service. This is meant to be just that, something recognisable as worship – but not Holy Communion and not Morning Prayer.

This service is intended for everyone - those who are regular church members, those who come occasionally and those who would like to take the opportunity to dip a toe into finding out more about Christian thought and worship.

There is no upper or lower age limit, and we try to provide activities, music and teaching which appeal to all.

It's not loud, or rowdy, nor is it too solemn. The atmosphere is relaxed but the service is not just for entertainment. We don't insist that children sit clamped to their seats, nor do we encourage them to run around! it is not a 'Children's Service' but children are welcome.

In writing this I have tried to respond to some of the criticisms, misunderstandings and comments which have been made directly to me, or which have come to my ears since we started the service.

Over the years we have done all sorts of things, but the main elements are as follows:

We start with refreshments which people can bring to their places if they haven't finished when the service starts.

The church seating is arranged round tables so people can see and speak to each other and everyone is encouraged to ask questions or comment on what is said and done.

We use a screen – so no hymn books are needed, and we use a mixture of familiar and less well-known hymns and songs. It's good to learn something new every now and then. The service has a regular but not rigid pattern.

We only need a leaflet occasionally, for instance when we use a Celtic form of worship or there is a Baptism, but mostly the texts are on the screen. So with books and papers...

There is usually a craft activity of some sort – the results are varied, but the activity is fun.

What was that - fun, in church..... yes, fun. Recently we have been delighted to notice how adults fall on colouring with enthusiastic glee! For some reason there are never enough red felt-tips to go round! Recently, we coloured flags to celebrate VE.

Day and used them as bunting to decorate the church. The children who were there that week were delighted because it tied in with what they had been doing in school.

On the 6th of July the service will be even more different than usual. Same time, same place but amongst other things, John are I are celebrating our Golden Wedding anniversary that weekend and we shall be renewing our vows. We would love to see as many friends as possible there - there will be cake. Do come, give it a go.

Chicheley Coach Trip - A Day at the Black

Country Living Museum

On Saturdáy 7th June, a lively coachload of Chicheley residents, plus friends from other villages, set off for a day out at the Black Country Living Museum—and what a brilliant day it was! With sunshine on our side and plenty of good spirits aboard, we were treated to a wonderful experience enjoyed by all ages.

The museum, located in Dudley, offers an immersive step back in time. Set across 26 acres, it brings to life the sights, sounds, smells (and tastes!) of the Black Country's industrial past. From riding on vintage fairground rides to chatting with costumed characters and sampling

traditional fish and chips cooked in a coal-fired fryer, there was something for everyone to enjoy. We especially loved exploring old-fashioned the sweet shop and schoolroom. well as finding the canal-side village and working replicas truly fascinating.



By the end of the day, there were plenty of tired feet and sleepy smiles—everyone was well and truly tuckered out after a day packed with discovery, laughter, and a bit of nostalgia.

Bulletin - July 2025

Hi Folks, Steve here with a roundup of PC activities around the Parish.

I'm afraid we have to shut the kiddies' play park between 27th June and 3rd July. The play park surface has developed several areas where mud has squelched through which then supports weeds to grow. This problem would simply get worse if we don't do something about it. We have agreed to go 50:50 with the original supplier on installing proper drainage (which we argue should have been done at the time of installation) which should rectify the problem. But of course, they need decent weather to do the job - hence the closure dates.

We are also taking the opportunity to renew the sloping path that leads to the play park as the surface of the current path has never really been satisfactory. The new path will be made from compressed rubber granules (mostly recycled tyres) and is water permeable. It should be easier to walk on and look smarter.

We hope you've noticed that work has been carried out by MKCC Highways to repair parts of Gog Lane and Folly Lane. There looks as if more needs to be done but at least it's a good start. They have surveyed these lanes during May and we are awaiting feedback on what is still outstanding and when it will be completed.

We're not far off halfway to the number of "yes" votes needed to apply for the installation of a 20mph limit around the High St area. If you haven't voted yet it would be really helpful to have your vote soon as we will be closing the voting window at the end of summer and unless we have 50% of all voters in favour we cannot take the idea any further. You can vote on the PC website www.northcrawley-pc.gov. uk. You might even get a knock on your door from one of our friendly Councillors who can answer any questions you may have.

Talking of speeding - we now have all 5 SIDs up and running at each major entrance to the village plus one in the centre of the village. Yay!! They will produce a lot of data about speeding patterns throughout each 24hr period and enable us to liaise with Thames Valley Police to identify areas where speed cameras would be most needed.

Thank you to Cllrs Kierney and Armstrong for offering to help with data gathering and interpretation.

We aim to carry out our Biennial survey later this year. You may remember that in the past we asked you to tell us what you think the PC's priorities should be and things like whether we communicate enough. It was from these responses that the idea of the SIDs emerged to help slow traffic through the village. It was also the reason we started this bulletin as there was an indication at the time that we didn't communicate what we do very effectively. Hopefully this has made a difference!!

We are going to consider some new questions and aspects to ask about and we'd be super grateful if you could help us by responding when the survey is published.

Finally, our wonderful long-standing Clerk, Sheila Bushnell has decided to retire from her role on the PC at the end of this year. We are, of course, very sad she will be leaving us but incredibly grateful for her many years of service to so many different groups of Councillors over the years. Her experience is irreplaceable, but she is very happy to share it with a new Clerk if we can attract someone to take her place. Ideally, we would like to operate for a few months with 2 clerks as the new Clerk learns the ropes from Sheila.

It's a paid role that takes around 40 hours a month and there will be much more detail in adverts on Facebook and in SCAN so if you think you might be interested, please keep an eye out for them.

- Respect the rural location and its surrounding countryside.
- Celebrate the village identity and sense of community.
- Engage the local community in creating the artwork.
- Be made from natural materials.
- · Be permanent.






The submission deadline is Monday 30 June, Milton Keynes Art Centre will go through applications and shortlist that week and then interview from 14 July.

Proposed time frame* July-August: Project scoped, artist meets with residents, decides site and provides more detailed proposal for approval by residents with costings. Sept-October: Planning permission sought, ground surveys, risk analyses. *this is a proposed time frame, which can be adapted with the selected artist.

Ongoing Village Improvements

The low fences at the Pavilion and the Knoll have replaced and the new installation looks rather good. The highway white lines on High Street have had a refresh – including the '30 mph' warnings at the Village entrances, and the 'Keep Clear' at Haynes garage. A more subtle update involved a man from Ringway using white paint and stencils as he worked his way around the village freshening up all the lamp post numbers. Please use these numbers to report any outages. Grass cutting on the Knoll, the Village Hall Park and the Church is now with a local company and the three sites are looking better than they have for some time. Keep up the good work.

Awareness Up – Flood Risk Management



The weather has been unusually dry and warm recently. We hear occasional forecast of storms and these often result in heavy rainfall. With intense rainfall the Village might be at risk from flooding with surface water on the roads. Please keep an eye out for any drainage features that are blocked or not functioning properly. You can report to the Parish Council who can direct the concern to those responsible, whether it be the Highway Authority, the landowner or Anglian Water. When reporting please use What3 Words to pinpoint the issue to the nearest square metre – https://what3words.com/ – a photo also helps.

Biodiversity Projects



The Community Woodland at Stonepits Copse has new signboards to encourage walkers to venture into the site, one at High Street and one at the stile if you are taking the Right of Way near Charlesberry Cattery.

The footpaths are regularily maintained and the track across the field is clear and dry (take care of nettles!).

The vegetation is very healthy and there is a lot of bird song with numbers increasing as the trees develop.




